D. 186*2*, in consequence of *Pneumonia*.She further declares that she was married to the said *George S. Kimball*on the *fifteenth* day of *March* A. D. 186*0*, that herhusband the aforesaid *George S. Kimball* died on the day above

mentioned, and that she has remained a widow ever since that period and still remains

the widow of the said *Geo. S. Kimball* as will more fully appear by

reference to the proof hereto annexed, she also declares that she has not in any manner been engaged

in or aided or abetted the rebellion in the United States. And the above named *Carrie M.**Kimball* further deposes and declares that there are the following childrenof said *George S. Kimball* living who were at his deceaserespectively of the ages set against their names, to wit: *Charles William Kimball**born on the twenty eighth day of May, A.D. 1860. & aged**a year and a half at the decease of said George S. Kimball*

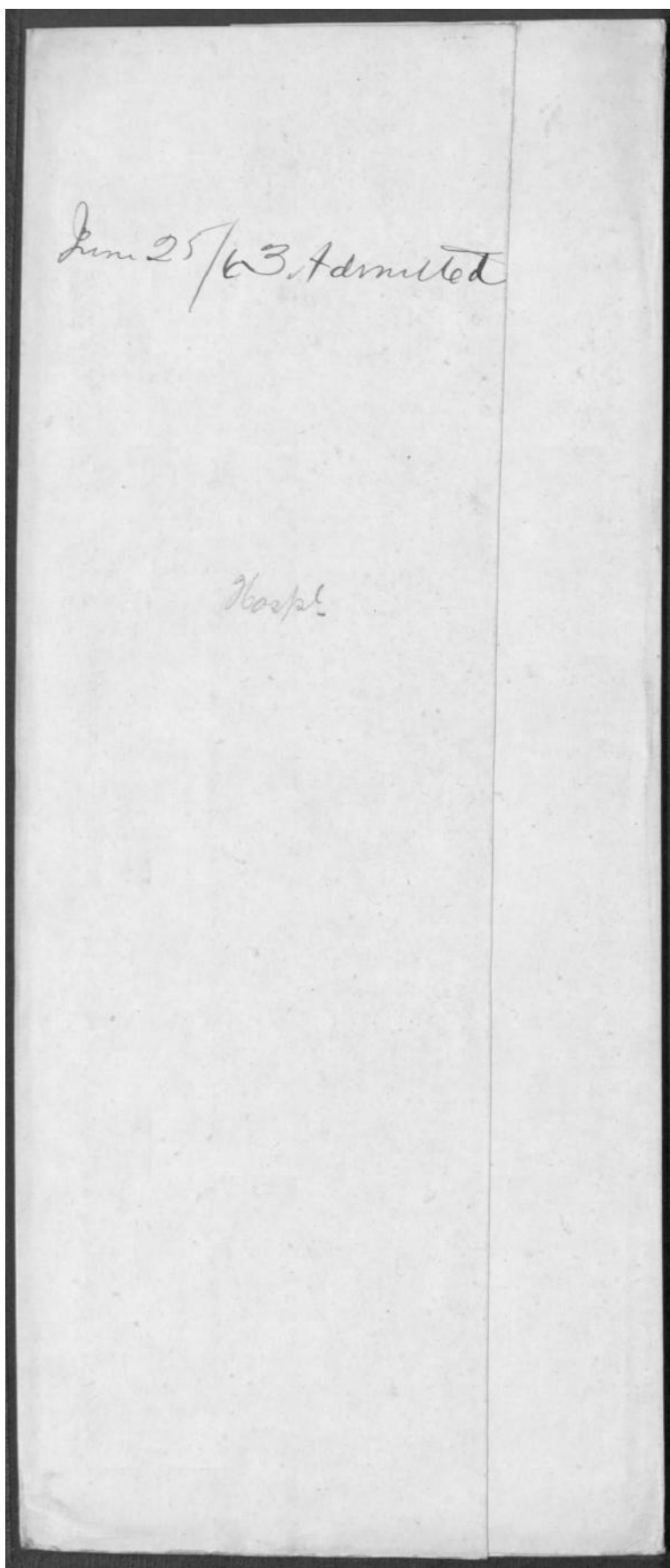
