DECLARATION FOR WIDOW'S PENSION.

STATE OF Indiana }
COUNTY OF Warrick } ss:

On this 29th day of May, A. D. one thousand nine hundred and one personally appeared before me, a Notary Public within and for the county and State aforesaid, Jessie H Hewitt, aged 50 years, a resident of Knights town, County of Warrick State of Indiana, who, being duly sworn according to law, makes the following declaration in order to obtain pension under the provisions of the act of Congress approved June 27, 1890, as amended by the act of May 9, 1900.

That she is the widow of Charles H Hewitt, who was Private 'enrolled' under the name of Charles H Hewitt at Indianapolis Ind on the 30th day of April, 1864 as a Private in Co 'B' 132nd Ind Vol Infy and honorably discharged Sept 7th, 1864 having served ninety days or more during the late war of the rebellion. That the soldier was not in the military or naval service of the United States except as stated above.

He did not serve in any organization during the war of 1861 to 1865 except the one named above
(If any other service it should be stated in full.)

That she was married under the name of Jessie H Kelborn to said soldier at Knights town Ind on the 16th day of October, 1879, by Rev W A Houtelinson; that there was no legal barrier to the marriage;

that she had not been previously married; that the soldier had been been previously married. Divorced at Indianapolis Ind Nov 5 1861 and divorced from 2 wife at Martinsville Ind July 26 1873
(If there was a prior marriage of either, the date and place of death or divorce of former consort or consorts should be stated.)

That the said soldier died Jan 28, 1894, at Knights town Indiana; that she was not divorced from him; that she has not remarried since his death; and that she is without other means of support than her daily labor and an actual net income not exceeding two hundred and fifty dollars per year.

That the said soldier left the following-named children who are now living and under sixteen years of age, to wit:

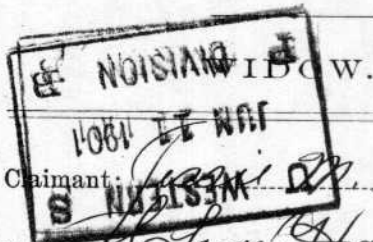

Declaration for Invalid Pension.

ACT OF JUNE 27, 1890.

[To be executed before a court of record or some officer thereof having custody of its Seal.]

State of Indiana, County of Henry, SS:

On this 17th day of September A.D., one thousand eight hundred and ninety two, personally appeared before me, John M. Jones a Justice of the Peace Court, a Court of Record within and for the County and State aforesaid, Charles Hewitt aged 54 years, a resident of the town of Knightstown County of Henry State of Indiana, who, being duly sworn according to law, declares that he is the identical Charles Hewitt who was enrolled on the 30th day of April 1864, in Private Co B 132nd Regt 54th Vol. Infy [Here state rank, company and regiment in military service, or vessel, if in the Navy.]

in the war of the Rebellion, and served at least ninety days, and was honorably discharged at Indianapolis Ind. on the 17th day of September 1864 That he is unable to earn a support by reason of Mercuria on right side, Rheumatism and nervous debility, throat disease [Here name the diseases or injuries from which disabled.]

That said disabilities are not due to his vicious habits, and are to the best of his knowledge and belief permanent. That he has not applied for pension under application No. That he is a pensioner under Certificate No. never applied [If a pensioner, the certificate number only need be given; if not, give the number of the former application, if one was made.]

That he makes this declaration for the purpose of being placed on the pension-roll of the United States under the provisions of the act of June 27 1890.

He hereby appoints Lee Ferguson of Knightstown State of Indiana, his true and lawful attorney to prosecute his claim. That his post-office address is Knightstown County of Henry State of Indiana

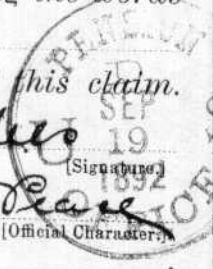

The act of June 27, 1890, requires, in case of a soldier:
(1) An honorable discharge (but the certificate need not be filed unless called for.)
(2) A minimum service of ninety days.
(3) A permanent physical disability not due to vicious habits. (It need not have originated in the service.)
(4) The rates under the act are graded from \$6 to \$12, proportioned to the degree of inability to earn a support, and are not affected by the rank held.
(5) A pensioner under prior laws may apply under this one, or a pensioner under this one may apply under other laws, but he can not draw more than one pension for the same period.
